At-Home Printmaking Supply List

Lithography Printmaking with James Boychuk - Hunter

- A sheet of glass or plexi-glas with covered and protected edges (could be from a picture frame and tape any sharp edges) This will be used to mount the paper plate on, needs to be slightly larger than your paper/print
- A small piece of glass or plexi-glas with covered and protected edges (could be from a picture frame and tape any sharp edges) This will be used as your ink palette
- Palette knife
- Xeroxed paper plate (such as a photocopy)
- 4" Brayer or roller (could also use other items for rolling out ink such as a plastic rolling pin or pill bottle, or purchase from a local art store)
- Oil based ink (lithography ink ideally)
- Gum Arabic (optional, can be purchased from art stores or food grade options from bulk stores)
- 3" Bristle Brush
- Sponge
- Water bucket
- Rags
- Canola/Vegetable oil
- Container to use for soaking paper in water (such as a tray or baking sheet or container, or bathtub!) You could also use a spray bottle to dampen paper
- Disposable vinyl/latex gloves
- Barren, bone folder, or a wooden spoon for transferring image by hand (can purchase from an art store or use a wooden spoon from the kitchen or your hand to print and apply even pressure!)

*Please note you can substitute and try other materials and tools as you see fit or have available to you! Part of the joy of at-home printing is being creative with what you have!
